Per The Texas Open Meetings Act, The Governing Body Is Not Permitted To Take Action On Or Discuss Any Item Not Listed On The Agenda. Overview and Background:

On May 1, 2021, a General Election was held for the purpose of electing two (2) Council Members (Places 1 and 5), to the Fate City Council to hold office for a period of three years. State law requires that the governing body of the City of Fate canvass all elections. For the purpose of canvassing a city election, only two members of the city council are needed to constitute a quorum.

The unofficial election results are found below. The Early Voting Ballot Board (EVBB) will convene on the morning of Monday, May 10th to qualify and count any provisional ballots or ballots by mail. A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF FATE, TEXAS, CANVASSING THE RETURNS OF THE GENERAL ELECTION HELD ON MAY 1, 2021, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING TWO (2) COUNCIL MEMBERS, (PLACES 1 AND 5), TO THE FATE CITY COUNCIL TO HOLD OFFICE FOR A PERIOD OF THREE YEARS; DECLARING RESULTS OF THAT ELECTION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on February 1, 2021 the City Council approved Resolution No. R-2021-014 ordering a General Election to be held on May 1, 2021 for the purpose of electing two (2) Council Members, (Places 1 and 5), to the Fate City Council, to hold office for a period of three years; and

WHEREAS, the election was duly and legally held on May 1, 2021, in conformity with the election laws of the State of Texas, and the results of the election have been certified by the proper judges and clerks; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Fate, Texas convened on May 10, 2021, to consider the returns of the General election held on May 1, 2021; and

WHEREAS, it appears to the Council, and the Council finds, that the election was in all respects lawfully held; and

WHEREAS, it appears to the Council, and the Council finds, that the tabulation of the election is correct.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FATE, TEXAS:

Section 1: The general election held May 1, 2021 was duly called, notice of election was given in accordance with law, and the election was held in accordance with law.

Action Requested: Approve ordinance canvassing the returns of the May 1, 2021 bond election.

This item is presented to canvass the May 1, 2021 bond election returns, as required by law.

Overview and Background:

A special bond election was held on May 1, 2021 to decide if the City is authorized to issue \$15 million in bonds to finance various road construction projects within the City. The road projects include:

- Turn Lanes at FM 551 and Interstate 30
- Gettysburg to Blackland
- Watertower Rd. North and South
- Woodcreek Blvd. Extension to Interstate 30 Frontage Road
- Riding Club Road East Realignment

The proposition passed with 656 votes “For” the bond and 401 votes “Against” the bond.

The Early Voting Ballot Board (EVBB) will convene on the morning of Monday, May 10th to qualify and count any provisional ballots or ballots by mail. Said ballots will not impact the overall outcome of the election. The City will receive the final tabulation of votes after the EVBB convenes on Monday, May 10th. The attached ordinance will be updated with any changes to the preliminary canvass results when received from the Rockwall County Elections Administrator.

ORDINANCE CANVASSING ELECTION RETURNS

THE STATE OF TEXAS
COUNTY OF ROCKWALL
CITY OF FATE

WHEREAS, this City Council (the "Council") ordered an election to be held in the City of Fate, Texas (the "City") on May 1, 2021, on the proposition hereinafter stated, and has authorized all matters pertaining to said election, including the ordering, giving notice, officers, holding and making returns of said election; and

WHEREAS, the election officers who held said election have duly made the returns of the result thereof, and said returns have been duly delivered to the Council; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was adopted was open to the public, and public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given, all as required by Chapter 551, Texas Government Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FATE, TEXAS:

1. The Council officially finds and determines that said election was duly ordered, that proper notice of said election was duly given, that proper election officers were duly appointed prior to said election, that said election was duly held, that the City has complied with the Federal Voting Rights Act and the Texas Election Code, that due returns of the result of said election have been made and delivered, and that the Council has duly canvassed said returns, all in accordance with law and the ordinance calling said election.

2. The Council officially finds and determines that the following votes were cast at said election, on the submitted proposition by the resident, qualified electors of the City, who voted at the election:

CITY OF FATE, TEXAS SPECIAL ELECTION CITY OF FATE, TEXAS PROPOSITION A

656 VOTES FOR

Shall the City Council of the City of Fate, Texas, be authorized to issue and sell the bonds of said City, in one or more series or issues, in the aggregate principal amount of \$15,000,000, for the purpose of designing, constructing, reconstructing, improving, extending, expanding, upgrading and developing streets, roads, sidewalks, thoroughfares and related improvements in the City, including pedestrian right of ways, related drainage, utility relocation, signalization, landscaping, lighting, and signage; with said bonds to be issued in one or more series or issues, to mature, bear interest at such rate or rates, not to exceed the respective limits prescribed by law at the time of issuance, and to be sold at such price or prices, as the City Council in its discretion shall determine; and shall there be levied and pledged, assessed and collected annually ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in said City in an amount sufficient, within the limits prescribed by law, to pay the annual interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund to pay said bonds at maturity?

3. The Council officially finds, determines and declares the result of said election to be that the aforesaid proposition HAS received a favorable majority vote, and that such proposition therefore has PASSED, and that the aforesaid bonds MAY be issued, and the aforesaid bond tax MAY be levied, assessed and collected annually as voted and provided by law.

Action Requested: Approve resolution canvassing the returns of the May 1, 2021 special election to consider dissolving the FDC and shift the FDC sales tax to general fund.

This item is presented to canvass the May 1, 2021 special election returns, as required by law.

Overview and Background:

A special election was held on May 1, 2021 to decide if the City is authorized to dissolve the Fate Development Corporation (FDC) and shift the FDC sales tax to the general fund. The proposition passed with 817 votes "For" the proposition and 223 votes "Against" the proposition. The Early Voting Ballot Board (EVBB) will convene on the morning of Monday, May 10th to qualify and count any provisional ballots or ballots by mail. Said ballots will not impact the overall outcome of the election. The City will receive the final tabulation of votes after the EVBB convenes on Monday, May 10th. The attached resolution will be updated with any changes to the preliminary canvass results and Exhibit A will be added when received from the Rockwall County Elections Administrator.

The tax shift becomes effective after one complete calendar quarter from the date the Comptroller receives that notice.

- Thus, voter approval in May and Comptroller receipt of our canvass packet before June 30th would result in that tax change beginning October 1st (i.e. following the July-August-September quarter).
- The same is true of the repeal of a tax, that repeal (assuming the same timeline as the above) is effective October 1.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FATE, TEXAS, CANVASSING THE SPECIAL ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF FATE ON MAY 1, 2021, FOR THE PURPOSE OF DISSOLVING THE TYPE B ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION AND ADOPTING A ONE AND ONE-HALF PERCENT SALES TAX; DECLARING THE RESULTS OF SAID ELECTION; AND RESOLVING OTHER MATTERS ON THE SUBJECT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Fate, Texas (“City Council”) ordered and called a Special Election (“Election”) to be held on Saturday, May 1, 2021 for the purpose of dissolving the Type B Economic Development Corporation and adopting a one and one-half percent sales tax to be deposited in the general fund of the City of Fate; and

WHEREAS, the said Election of the City of Fate, Texas (“City”), was held in the City on May 1, 2021, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City has caused to be posted and published in accordance with the election laws of the State of Texas, notices of the Election; and

WHEREAS, notices of the Election were actually given by the City and the Rockwall County Elections Administrator as required by state law; and

WHEREAS, the City Secretary presented affidavits of posting and publication of the notices of the Election; and

WHEREAS, the affidavits of posting the publishing notices of the Election were examined and approved; and

WHEREAS, the Election was duly and legally held on May 1, 2021 in the City and in conformity with the election laws of the State of Texas, and the results of the Election, including the early voting results, have been certified and returned by the proper election judges and clerks thereof; and

WHEREAS, the City Secretary, acting as special custodian of the election records, presented the canvass report for the Election, including the returns of the early ballots cast in connection therewith, to the Canvassing Board; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, acting in its capacity as the Canvassing Board for the Election, has considered the returns of said Election, including the returns of said ballots cast in connection therewith; and

WHEREAS, the returns of the Election, including the returns of early ballots cast in connection therewith, duly and legally made, showed that there were cast at said Election,

the following total valid and legal votes:

Fate Proposition 1:

Termination of the Fate Development Corporation (Type B) and its associated sales tax; and the adoption of a local sales and use tax in the City of Fate at a rate of one and one-half (1.5) percent. This would result in no net change in the total sales tax rate.

For: 817
Against: 223

The termination of the Fate Development Corporation (Type B) and its associated sales tax; and the adoption of a local sales and use tax in the City of Fate at a rate of one and one-half (1.5) percent is passed.

The number of votes by which the proposition was approved is 594.

WHEREAS, the City Council, at a Special Council Meeting on May 10, 2021, canvassed the returns of said election; and

WHEREAS, section 67.003 of the Texas Election Code provides that each local canvassing authority shall convene not earlier than the third (3rd) day or later than the eleventh (11th) day after election day for the purpose of canvassing the election results; and

WHEREAS, section 67.004(a) of the Texas Election Code also provides that only two members of City Council are needed and constitute a quorum for the purpose of canvassing election results; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, at a Special Council Meeting on May 10, 2021, canvassed the returns of said election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FATE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Incorporation of Premises. The above and foregoing premises are true and correct and are incorporated into the body of this Resolution and made a part hereof for all purposes.

SECTION 2. Confirmation of Vote Tabulations. The results of the Election, as canvassed and tabulated above reflect the expressed desires of the resident qualified voters of the City.

SECTION 3. Issuance of Certificate of Election. That the Mayor is hereby authorized

and directed to execute and deliver a Certificate of Election.

SECTION 4. Issuance of Canvass of Special Election. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the Canvass of the Election, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A", in accordance with the election laws of the State of Texas, and to take all other action necessary connection therewith.

SECTION 5. Effective Date. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, and it is accordingly so resolved.
